A Letter to the Global Music Industry



The global music industry appears to be thriving generating \$28.6 billion in revenue in 2023 alone. But the reality for most artists who power this machine is far from glamorous. Behind the awards shows and viral hits lies a systemic crisis affecting the very people who create the music we live by. The numbers speak for themselves:



Nearly 60% of musicians earn less than \$30,000/year from music-related income. Many report needing multiple jobs just to survive.

(SoundCloud Artist Income Report, 2023)



Only 12% of that \$28.6B goes to artists. The rest is absorbed by labels, distributors, and intermediaries. (Citigroup Report, 2023)



Streaming pays most artists less than one cent per stream, about \$0.003 on average. It takes over 800,000 streams on Spotify just to earn minimum wage in a month. (Tidal, Spotify payout data) Mental health struggles in the music industry are 3x higher than the general population. Anxiety, depression, and suicide ideation are common, driven by financial instability, lack of support, and industry pressures. (Record Union, 2019)
